RECYCLING COMMITTEE

The Recycling and Solid Waste Committee is comprised of all volunteer residents of Bow. Meetings are held the 1st Tuesday of each month (except July & August), at 7:30 pm at the Municipal Building. The Committee serves as a sounding board for the community for matters dealing with recycling and solid waste. The committee's regular duties include:

- Coordinating the Town's Household Hazardous Waste Day collection, including review of bid proposals and assistance to obtain state grants (up to \$2,500) to defray part of the collection costs.
- Promoting recycling and conservation education in the Bow community and the Bow Schools.

PICK-UP OF BULKY ITEMS

Bow residents have two options regarding bulky items.

HOLIDAY SCHEDULE

Within the holiday week, trash collection will occur on schedule on the days preceding the holiday. Collections scheduled for the holiday, as well as the remainder of the week will be delayed one day. When a holiday falls on a Friday, Saturday, or Sunday, there will be no impact on the collection schedule.

Ex: Thanksgiving falls on a Thursday. Customers with scheduled collections Monday through Wednesday of that week will not be affected. Thursday's collections will occur on Friday, & Friday's collections will occur on Saturday.

Collection will be delayed for the following holidays:

- New Year's Day
- Memorial Day
- 4th of July
- Labor Day
- Thanksgiving
- Christmas Day







HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE & ELECTRONICS RECYCLING DAY ANNUALLY, ON A SATURDAY IN OCTOBER • 8:30 AM - 1:00 PM

Bow Community Building (Intersection of Logging Hill, Bow Center & Knox Roads)

Bring any of the following residential waste for NO CHARGE (Fees will apply for electronics):

AUTOMOTIVE: auto batteries, brake, transmission & power steering fluid, antifreeze, used motor oil.

BATTERIES: rechargeable & NiCad and other batteries containing heavy metals.

CLEANERS: drain & oven cleaners, degreasers, metal polishers, rug & upholstery cleaners, disinfectants, ammonia, air fresheners

COMPACT FLUORESCENT LIGHTBULBS: If broken, contain bulb in a lidded glass jar and store in nonliving area (ie in garage) until hazardous waste day. Bulbs are accepted at Hazardous Waste Day and, if intact, year-round at Home Depot.

ELECTRONICS (fees apply): all computer components, printers, cellular and regular telephones, TVs & other electronics (VCRs, DVD players, etc.)

MERCURY THERMOMETERS & THERMOSTATS

PAINTS: oil paint lacquer, stains, and other finishes paint removers, turpentine, furniture strippers

PESTICIDES/INSECTICIDES: for pets, pests, yards/gardens **SNEAKERS:** for recycling into playground surfaces. Any brand, no metal parts

OTHER: household chemicals (e.g., toxic glues), pool chemicals, driveway sealer, and propane tanks.

*** DO NOT BRING THE FOLLOWING***

Latex paint or household alkaline batteries (these go in regular curbside trash; paint must be DRY AND SOLID (can use kitty litter, sand, etc. to solidify), propane tanks, building materials & air conditioners (bring to Concord Transfer Station); computer printer cartridges (bring to Staples or Best Buy), prescription drugs (accepted at Bow Safety Center, Concord Police or CVS on Hall Street), explosives, radioactive wastes, asbestos products and medical wastes (require special handling).

RECYCLE RIGHT!

Recycling rules have changed. What you think you know may not be accurate. Many items that may have recycle value, are not allowed in the Single Stream mix. Just because an item is Metal, Paper, Glass or has a triangle on it, doesn't make it acceptable. Here are some simple guidelines that should help you to Recycle Right.

METAL Food & Beverage Cans, Clean Aluminum	PLASTIC Bottles, Jars, Jugs, Tubs 5 gallon maximum	GLASS Bottles, Jars	PAPER/CARDBOARD Paper, Newspaper, Magazines, Boxes
If it's not made of aluminum, tin, or metal It's Trash	If it did not come with a lid or cap It's Trash	If it did not come with a lid, cap or cork It's Trash	If you can't tear it It's Trash
R C Electronics, Batteries, Pots, Pans, Clothes Hangers, Tools, Electrical Cords	Bags, Wrap Tarps, Film, Styro-foam Clothes Hangers, CDs, Utensils, Straws, Cups, Garden Hoses, Toys, Cell Phone Cases, Flower, Planters, Rubber	Ceramics, Baking Glass, Light Bulbs, Windows, Porcelain	Waxed Paper, Orange Juice/ Milk Cartons, Hard Cover Books, Plastic Coated Paper, Wrapping Paper, Tissue Paper

The largest source of contamination is plastic bags, styrofoam, and food waste.

When in doubt, go to www.RecycleSmartNH.org Enter in the item to find out if it's recycling or trash! Because of global changes to recycling, the industry has changed how they describe what can and can't be recycled in residential programs. They have moved away from the "look for the symbol," and "1-7" terminology, and instead are spelling out the TYPES of items that are included in the program.

Important Information

DETAILS ABOUT YOUR CURBSIDE COLLECTION PROGRAM



Trash Collection: FREE CART Provided by the TownEach residence may place ONE town-provided 65-gallon cart curbside weekly for trash collection. Remember that all trash MUST BE BAGGED before being placed in the cart. If your household generates additional trash that cannot be handled with one cart, you may subscribe to overflow trash service from Casella Waste Services (see below). Items left outside of the cart WILL NOT BE COLLECTED. If your household has carts in need of repair, please contact the Town of Bow Public Works Department, 12 Robinson Road, (603) 228-2207.



Over low Trash Collection: SUBSCRIPTION SERVICE through Casella Waste Services

Recyclable material makes up, on average, 60% of household waste. By recycling everything our program allows, the cart provided by the Town should be sufficient for most residents' trash needs. For those with greater trash needs Casella Waste Services is providing overflow service for an annual fee of \$211.00. The subscription period will run from May 1st - April 30th, and pro-rated for those subscribing after the start date. Subscription customers will receive a second cart, with a yellow lid, which can be placed curbside along with the cart provided by the Town. At the end of the subscription period, if you choose **NOT** to renew, Pinard will remove the cart. BLUE CARTS: Single Stream Recycling Single Stream Recycling is a program that allows you to place all of your recyclables in one bin - NO MORE SORTING! All recyclables must be placed in the collection cart; items left outside the cart WILL NOT BE COLLECTED. If your family is in need of additional carts for recycling, Casella Waste Services can provide you with an additional recycling cart for a one-time fee of \$95.00 for a 65 gallon cart, or \$125.00 for a 95 gallon. Unlike the service described above, this fee is for the purchase of the cart, not an annual subscription. You will NOT need to contact Pinard Waste Systems annually to continue with the use of this cart. To order your additional recycling cart, simply call (800) 675-7933.

Guidelines for Automated Collection

Please read this resident user guide completely. It contains important program information.


- All trash should be bagged and placed in a green cart with the lid closed.
- Trash left beside the cart or in other containers will not be collected.
- Collection carts must be set in an accessible location: At least 5 feet from any obstruction such as trees, telephone poles, parked cars, mailboxes, other carts, etc. Approximately 2 feet from the curb and away from low hanging utility lines.
- Carts that are inaccessible will not be serviced until the following week.
- The cart must be placed so that the handle faces the house.
- All carts must be at the curb by 7:00 AM on your collection day.
- No hazardous or building materials, yard waste, brush, or recyclables should be placed in trash carts.
- Blue recycling carts should be placed following the same guidelines as trash carts.

Missing or Damaged Carts

If for some reason the cart is destroyed, a new cart will be provided free of charge upon the return of the damaged cart. Missing carts will be replaced upon notification to The Public Works Department. Damaged carts will be repaired at no cost to the resident. Call Bow Public Works at **603-228-2207**.

Place collection cart 2 feet from curb, and at least 5 feet from any obstruction (ie. parked car, other carts, or a tree).

On one way streets, carts should be placed on the right-hand side of the street.
